A Stewardship Moment

In today's first reading the prophet Malachi compares our need for conversion with the refinement of gold and silver. To purify these precious metals, gold and silversmiths subjected their ores to extreme heat. As the metals reached temperatures as high as 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit, impurities began to melt away and only the precious metal in its purest form remained. When these ancient refiners saw their reflections in the metal, they knew the gold or silver was ready; that it was pure. Good stewards know they, too, are full of impurities, and the only way God will see his image in them is when they allow themselves to undergo constant refinement; to accept ongoing conversion to take place in their lives. Do we take active steps to improve and refine our lives? Do we allow Christ to help us rid ourselves of our impurities?

Un Momento de Corresponsabilidad

En la primera lectura de hoy, el profeta Malaquías compara nuestra necesidad de conversión con el refinamiento del oro y la plata. Para purificar estos metales preciosos, los orfebres y plateros sometían estos minerales al calor extremo. A medida que los metales alcanzaban temperaturas de hasta 2.000 grados Fahrenheit, las impurezas comenzaban a derretirse y solo quedaba el metal precioso en su forma más pura. Cuando estos antiguos refinadores veían sus reflejos en el metal, sabían que el oro o la plata ya estaban listos; que eran puros. Los buenos corresponsables saben que ellos también están llenos de impurezas, y que la única forma en que Dios verá su imagen reflejada en ellos es cuando se dejan someter a un refinamiento constante; aceptan la conversión continua que tendrá lugar en sus vidas. ¿Tomamos medidas activas para mejorar y refinar nuestras vidas? ¿Permitimos que Cristo nos ayude a deshacernos de nuestras impurezas?

Healthy Soil: Practical Tips for New & Seasoned Gardeners; A FREE 10-Minute University Webinar

Wednesday February 5th from 12:00 noon – 1:00 pm. Can't attend? Register and receive a recording link 2 days after the session.

This class will look first at what soil is, and what plants need from it. Then we will look at practical tips: what we can and can't fix; how long these attempts to change soil will last; issues around drainage, compost, and excess phosphorus; and how to deal with “clay” soils (and soils that act like clay). Moving to specific cases, we will look at current best practices for four situations:

1. Gardening where the ground has been compacted for home construction;
2. Starting a vegetable garden;
3. Filling a raised bed; and
4. Maintaining an established landscape or garden.
