One of the most simple yet powerful things we can do for another person is to pray for them. Prayer for a person is an act of love, showing that we care for them, and doing something for them. And one of the most powerful ways to show we care for someone is when they ask us to pray for them, to do it right then and there. In my homily this weekend I am talking about the art of praying with people, and I want to share this short "how to" guide which I put together and have found useful.

How to pray with people 101

- Ask "Can I pray with you?"
- Ask "What can I pray for you for?"
- Begin with the Sign of the Cross.
- Ask Jesus/The Father/The Holy Spirit to be present in whatever situation they mention.
- End with "Let us pray as Jesus taught us: Our Father...."
- End with Sign of the Cross

Do's and Don'ts

- Don't: try to fix problems or give advice
- Do: ask for Gifts of the Holy Spirit, e.g. healing, comfort, peace, discernment, wisdom, knowledge, counsel, understanding, fortitude
- Do: be ok with using the exact same words they used
- Don't: Pray for what you think they need
- Do: Leave some silence, either before or after speaking

I encourage you in your regular daily lives to pray for people. It's not complicated. It's simple person-to-person sharing of the Love of Jesus Christ.

Cómo orar con la gente 101

- Pregunte "¿Puedo orar con usted?"
- Pregunte "¿Por qué puedo orar por usted?"
- Comience con la Señal de la Cruz.
- Pídale a Jesús/El Padre/El Espíritu Santo que esté presente en cualquier situación que mencionen.
- Termine con "Oremos como Jesús nos enseñó: Padre nuestro....".
- Terminar con la Señal de la Cruz

Normas

- No: intente solucionar problemas o dar consejos
- Sí: pedir Dones del Espíritu Santo, ej. sanar, consuelo, paz, discernimiento, sabiduría, conocimiento, consejo, entendimiento, fortaleza
- Sí: estar de acuerdo con usar exactamente las mismas palabras que usaron
- No: orar por lo que cree que necesitan
- Sí: Dejar un poco de silencio, ya sea antes o después de hablar

Los animo en su vida diaria regular oren por personas. No es complicado. Es un simple intercambio de persona a persona del Amor de Jesucristo.

Social Justice Mass Intention

You are invited to attend and pray on Tuesday, March 14. The Mass intention is for: **All women and their contributions.**

Today, throughout the world, women hold positions of exacting leadership, as heads of government, judges, research doctors, symphony conductors, and business executives. They serve as presidents at Catholic colleges and universities and as administrators and faculty members at Catholic colleges and seminaries. They are also chief executives of Catholic hospitals and executive directors of Catholic Charities. An increasing number of Catholic theologians are women. Some women serve the diocesan churches as school superintendents and chancellors, as archivists and members of marriage tribunals. More and more women have responsible national positions in the Catholic Church. Locally, we can see in our parishes the scope of women's leadership: in various liturgical ministries, including altar servers and proclaiming the Word before the assembly; in pastoral ministry and administration; in religious education and teaching in schools; in peace and justice activities; in outreach to the homebound and the hospitalized. One recent study shows that 85 percent of nonordained ministerial positions in parishes are now held by women.

Stewardship Moments

Jesus' longest-recorded conversation with anyone is the one he has with the Samaritan woman at the well. She discovers she can be honest with Jesus and goes and tells others about him. She gives witness. She's not the most certain, thorough or even convincing witness. But her witness is enough. It is inviting, humble, non-judgmental and sincere. What is the quality of our witness? How do our words and actions give daily testimony on behalf of Christ? During this season of Lent, how might we do a better job at proclaiming the risen Lord in word and deed?

St. Vincent de Paul Pantry Update

During February our pantry served 69 families, comprised of 293 people, providing almost 6,000 pounds of food. Every month we receive donations of food from parishioners, non-parishioners, Albertsons, Costco, and other businesses such as Godfather's Pizza who recently held a food drive for us. We encourage parishioners to support these businesses that, in turn, enable our ministry to provide this assistance. In addition, we purchased food from the Oregon Food Bank and food and toiletry items from local stores. We also offer aid to families in our parish boundaries with rent and utility assistance. During the school year we provide food backpacks to children at McKinley Elementary School. Currently we provide 25 backpacks each weekend. Please remember that this is St. Vincent de Paul giving weekend. The generosity and kindness of our parishioners is greatly appreciated.




