Stewardship Moment

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. This weekend we participate in the proclamation of the passion and death of Jesus according to the Gospel of Mark. In the extended version of this weekend's Gospel reading, Jesus is at Gethsemane, praying to his Father, in much emotional distress. He knows he can save himself. He can escape over the Mount of Olives in the dead of night and make his way safely into the Judean desert. Instead, Jesus chooses obedience to his Father and waits for his persecutors. As Saint Paul puts it in the second reading, Jesus is "obedient to the point of death." Jesus' obedience is a lesson for those who are good stewards of their life in Christ. Let us reflect on how we might be more obedient to the will of God instead of our own will.

Domingo de Ramos de la Pasión del Señor. Este fin de semana participamos en la proclamación de la pasión y muerte de Jesús de acuerdo al Evangelio de San Marcos. En la versión larga de la lectura del Evangelio de este fin de semana, Jesús está en Getsemaní, orando a su Padre, en un gran sufrimiento emocional. Él sabe que puede salvarse a sí mismo. Puede escapar entre el Monte de los Olivos en medio de la noche y emprender su camino a salvo en el desierto de Judea. En cambio, Jesús elige obedecer a su Padre y espera a sus perseguidores. Como lo expresa San Pablo en la segunda lectura, Jesús es "obediente hasta la muerte." La obediencia de Jesús es una lección para quienes son buenos corresponsables de su vida en Cristo. Reflexionemos sobre cómo podríamos ser más obedientes a la voluntad de Dios en lugar de obedecer nuestra propia voluntad.

And then say grace that encompasses gratitude for all the many gifts God has given us in this one meal.

Day 39) Pray Psalm 51: 9-11 "Cleanse me of sin with hyssop, that I may be purified; wash me and I shall be whiter than snow. Let me hear the sounds of joy and gladness; the bones you have crushed shall rejoice. Turn away your face from my sins and blot out all my guilt."

Quilts

St. Juan Diego Ministers having been taking Communion and offering prayer to Catholic patients at Kaiser Westside Hospital since it opened and work closely with their chaplains. Over the past 10 plus years, we have visited over 5,000 Catholic patients. Father Hans is often called by the chaplains to visit patients that are in need of a priest.

Through the years, SJD has provided rosaries for the chaplains to give if the patient request one. The chaplains also give a comfort quilt to patients in the hospital that are dying. These quilts, made with love, provide comfort not only to the patient but to their family. After, the family takes the quilt home as a comfort to them. At this time, the hospital only has a couple of quilts left and are not able to get them from the source they had. If anyone has or knows of anyone who makes quilts and would like to donate, we would love to be able to give them to the hospital. Please bring them to the church and mark for the hospital. 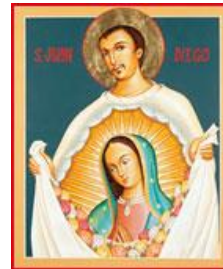
