Solidarity and Refugees

In Father Han's homily on September 4th and 5th we were reminded that as members of Christ's body we are our brothers and sisters keepers and that we must take on the suffering as the body of Christ in order to provide healing. The refugees fleeing from the armed and violent conflict in Afghanistan are our brothers and sisters and they are suffering.

Our Catholic social teaching has this to say about refugees and how we are to act in solidarity with them.

The Church is close to them [refugees] not only with her pastoral presence and material support, but also with her commitment to defend their human dignity: "Concern for refugees must lead us to reaffirm and highlight universally recognized human rights and to ask that the effective recognition of these rights be guaranteed to refugees". *Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church, Sec. 505* https://www.vatican.va/roman_curia/pontifical_councils/justpeace/documents/rc_pc_justpeace_doc_20060526_compendio-dott-soc_en.html

Pope Francis in his August 29th, 2021 Angelus Address had this to say about the situation in Afghanistan.

Dear brothers and sisters, with great concern I am following the situation in Afghanistan, and I take part in the suffering of those who are grieving for the persons who lost their lives in the suicide attacks that happened last Thursday [Aug. 26, 2021], and of those who are seeking help and protection. I entrust the deceased to the mercy of Almighty God and I thank those who are striving to help that population so tried, in particular the women and children. I ask everyone to continue to help the needy and to pray that dialogue and **solidarity** may lead to the establishment of a peaceful and fraternal coexistence and offer hope for the country's future. In historic moments like this one we cannot remain indifferent; the history of the Church teaches us this. As Christians this situation involves us. For this reason I address an appeal, to everyone, to intensify your prayer and practice fasting. Prayer and fasting, prayer and penance. This is the moment to do so. I am speaking seriously: intensify your prayer and practice fasting, asking the Lord for mercy and forgiveness. *Pope Francis, Angelus Address, August 29, 2021*

Solidaridad y refugiados

En la homilía del padre Hans del 4 y 5 de septiembre, se nos recordó que, como miembros del cuerpo de Cristo, somos guardianes de nuestros hermanas y hermanos y que debemos asumir el sufrimiento como el cuerpo de Cristo para poder brindar sanidad. Los refugiados que huyen del conflicto armado y violento en Afganistán son nuestros hermanos y hermanas y están sufriendo.

Nuestra doctrina social católica tiene esto que decir sobre los refugiados y cómo debemos actuar en solidaridad con ellos.

Encomiendo a los difuntos a la misericordia de Dios Todopoderoso y agradezco a quienes se esfuerzan por ayudar a esa población tan probada, en particular a las mujeres y los niños. Pido a todos que sigan ayudando a los más necesitados y que recen para que el diálogo y la solidaridad conduzcan al establecimiento de una convivencia pacífica y fraterna y ofrezcan esperanza para el futuro del país. En momentos históricos como éste no podemos permanecer indiferentes; la historia de la Iglesia nos lo enseña. Como cristianos, esta situación nos involucra. Por eso dirijo un llamamiento a todos para que intensifiquen su oración y practiquen el ayuno. Oración y ayuno, oración y penitencia. Este es el momento de hacerlo. Hablo en serio: intensifica tu oración y practica el ayuno, pidiendo al Señor misericordia y perdón. **Papa Francisco, Discurso del Ángelus, 29 de agosto de 2021**
